Sandwiched between two stints in the Peace Corps, Irene worked for 18 yrs at Redlands Christina Migrant Association (RCMA) with headquarters in Immokalee. Before coming to RCMA, she helped establish a management system for village health centers in the Democratic Republic of Congo when it was still Zaire and ruled by dictator Mobutu Zese Zeko. In her retirement, at the age of 70, she joined the Peace Corps once more and served as an HIV/AIDS technical adviser at the Blantyre City Health Department in Malawi.

Upon her return from Africa she wrote a memoir about her experiences titled "The Keys to the Congo". Irene is a mother of three and grandmother of five and currently lives in Fort Myers with her cat Thoko. A native of Switzerland, Irene is fluent in several languages and well traveled.
